Amid an economic downturn and without the power-packed crowds of last year's Robert Bateman exhibit, the McMichael Volunteer Committee, along with this year's 56 Canadian Artists and Sculptors, managed to exceed last year's record-breaking numbers at the weekend's 18th annual Autumn Art Sale.

There was \$116,000 worth of great art was sold; 221 works in total, grossing more than \$40,000 for Volunteer Committee programs and initiatives.

Tim Packer, 2007's Best in Show award recipient (and the first artist to sell more than \$10,000) exceeded \$20,000 this year to retain the title.

Funds raised at the sale help the Volunteer Committee supplement and complement the programs of the McMichael Canadian

Art Collection, including children's education programs and the Sunday Concert Series. We receive more than 200 applications annually for the opportunity to be a part of this prestigious event, and we're repeatedly told this is the best run art sale around.

NOTICE OF COMPLETION OF ENVIRONMENTAL STUDY REPORT

The above project is being planned under **Schedule B** in accordance with the requirements of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment document dated (June 2000). Subject to comments received as a result of this Notice, and the receipt of other necessary approvals, the Town of Caledon intends to proceed with the design and construction of this project. All four bridges have been identified as being deficient with respect to physical condition, barrier protection and load capacity.

Sneath Road Bridge – The existing structure located 0.3 km south of King Street on Sneath Road near Bolton will be removed and abandoned. The work is scheduled for completion by late 2009.

Heart Lake Road Bridge – The existing structure located on the 2nd Line East, 0.95 km north of Olde Baseline Road has been identified as being deficient. The preferred solution is to replace the structure with a new structure at the same location. The work is scheduled for completion by late 2009.

Kennedy Road Bridge 1 – located on the 1st Line East, 1.5 km north of Olde Baseline Road. The preferred solution is to rehabilitate the existing structure. The work is scheduled for completion by late 2009.

Kennedy Road Bridge 2 – located on the 1st Line East, 0.37 km north of the Charleston Sideroad. The preferred solution is to replace the structure with a new structure at the same location. The work is scheduled for completion by late 2009.

Interested persons may provide written comment to the County on the proposal within 30 calendar days from the date of this Notice. Comments should be directed to Mr. Bruno Knoepfli, C.E.T.

If concerns regarding this project cannot be resolved in discussion with the municipality, a person/party may request that the Minister of Environment make an order for the project to comply with Part II of the Environmental Assessment Act (referred to as a Part II Order), which addresses individual environment assessments. Requests must be received by the Minister at the address below within 30 calendar days of this Notice. A copy of the request must also be sent to the Town of Caledon. If there are no requests received by November 29, 2008, the four bridge replacements will proceed to design and construction as presented in the planning documentation.
